

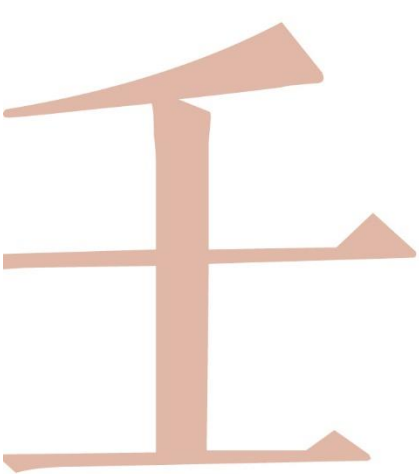

## FROM THE ISSCO PRESIDENT >>

We sailed through 2021, an unforgettable year, as we fought against the unruly COVID-19. We have received 2022 as the “last” pandemic winter in the spirit that “if winter comes, can spring be far away?”

Although the pandemic has brought a lot of daily inconveniences, members in their respective positions are fulfilling their job dutifully. It is particularly gratifying that, with the full support of board members, the 2021 Annual Conference of ISSCO was held successfully in three regions and time zones — Asia Pacific, Europe and Africa, as well as America, in the period between December 4 and 11, 2021. In all, hundreds of participants attended these regional conferences online. Participants intensively discussed the impact of COVID-19 on Chinese overseas and related themes, as well as the driving forces of anti-Chinese racism and xenophobia during the COVID-19 era. They also explored means by which Chinese overseas could safeguard their legitimate rights and interests, based on empirical findings and compelling arguments.

The ISSCO Board held its first ever online board meeting on December 12, 2021 (which was December 11 for some regions). Since board members were scattered around the world in different time zones, some had to attend the meeting in the early morning, while others late into the night. However, all 16 board members and 5 honorary life members overcame the hardship to attend the meeting. In particular, Professor Wang Gungwu, a nonagenarian, punctually signed on the internet at 6 am Singapore time to be with us; his attendance was inspiring to everyone. At the board meeting, it was decided that the 2022 ISSCO Annual Conference would be held at the University of Berkeley, where ISSCO was first founded in 1992. We look forward to commemorating the extraordinary history of ISSCO over the past 30 years and to celebrating the 30th birthday of ISSCO!

### **Beltrán Antolín, Joaquín**

Joaquín Beltrán Antolín has carried out several research projects together with Amelia Sáiz López and other scholars, such as “New socio-cultural, political and economic developments in East Asia in the global context”, “Population of Chinese origin in the Community of Navarre”, “Taiwanese in Spain”, and “The Chinese community facing hate speech during the Covid-19 pandemic” as well. One of them focused on the population of Chinese origin in Navarra, which consists of the parallel increase of the Chinese population and their establishment in smaller towns and villages where they open businesses to have their own clientele and not compete with each other. The other research is a work on the Taiwanese presence in Spain that is in progress.



### **Duan, Ying (段颖)**

Duan Ying has been promoted to Professor, and appointed Chair of the Anthropology Department at Sun Yat-sen University. He was also elected Board member of the Overseas Chinese History Society of China.



### **Guo, Shibao (郭世宝)**

Prof. Shibao Guo guest edited a special issue for the Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies, Chinese Diaspora Studies in a Transnational World, which was published Online First on October 25, 2021. This special issue examines the changing nature of the Chinese diasporas in a transnational world and its concomitant implications for Chinese diaspora studies internationally. Besides the research agenda-setting Introduction, this special issue consists of six empirically-based articles on Chinese diasporas studies, from a variety of disciplinary or interdisciplinary perspectives, by scholars who are members of ISSCO. Their perspectives have contributed to the existing Chinese diasporas literature and the interdisciplinary fields of ethnic, migration and mobility studies.

### **Lin, Ping (林平)**

Lin Ping is a new member of ISSCO, from National Chung Cheng University in Taiwan. Lin Ping's research concentrates on the outmigration of middle-class people, such as Taiwanese businessmen in Dongguan of China and Jakarta of Indonesia. Lin Ping is also conducting two other projects: the highly educated Chinese women in the Dutch East Indies (Oei Hui Lan and Anny Tan) and the Taiwan-Indonesia relations in the Cold War (1966-1971).

## ISSCO REGIONAL CONFERENCE (ONLINE)

#### >> ISSCO Asia Pacific Regional Conference (4-5 December 2021)



The Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences through the Department of Chinese Studies and the Malaysian Chinese Research Centre, in cooperation with the Taiwan Normal University, Sun Yat-Sen University in Guangzhou, and colleagues from Melbourne University, jointly organised the 2021 ISSCO (International Society for the Study of the Chinese Overseas) Asia Pacific Regional Conference. The conference is part of three regional conferences (North America region and the regions of Europe and Africa) organised by ISSCO. The Dean, Professor Wong, who is the ISSCO representative for Southeast Asia, is the organising chairman. The conference, with the theme of, Effects of Covid on the Chinese Diaspora in the Asia-Pacific and other themes on Chinese Overseas, attracted 39 papers (12 in English and 27 in Chinese). The conference was opened by Professor Li Minghuan, President of ISSCO who thanked the organising team for the efforts in putting together the conference. The two-day-conference also attracted a total of 150 participants, many of whom stayed through till the end.

#### >> ISSCO African and European Regional Conference (5 December 2021)



The ISSCO regional workshop for Africa and Europe was held on Sunday the 5 December 2021 and showcased presentations of some 16 participants from South Africa, California, Portugal, Italy, Denmark, France, Spain and China. The President of ISSCO, Li Minghuan, welcomed the presenters and other participants and Karen Harris, the ISSCO Africa executive board member introduced the speakers. The workshop was fairly well attended and included some engaging discussions highlighting the serious and often detrimental impact of Covid on overseas Chinese communities. The papers covered a range of issues at a transnational level as well as in regions in both Europe and Africa. The point was reiterated by many that anti-Chinese sentiments predated the pandemic, but in many cases had been enhanced or resurfaced as a result. The Workshop was coordinated by Prof Karen L. Harris of the University of Pretoria in South Africa, who was assisted by Professor Joaquín Antolín Beltrán of Universidad Autónoma de Barcelona. Mrs Alida Green and Nina Sieber – both of the University of Pretoria – kindly assisted with the strategic and technical support.

#### >> ISSCO North American Regional Conference (11 December 2021)



ISSCO board members, Madeline Hsu (UT Austin) and Li Wei (ASU) co-organized the roundtable "Effects of COVID on the Chinese Diaspora in North America" convened Saturday December 11, 2021 as the North American component of the 2021 regional conference. This event featured a keynote speech by Dr. Russell M. Jeung, Co-founder of Stop! AAPI Hate, (San Francisco State University), titled "Combatting Anti-Asian Hate During COVID-19." This roundtable also included the comprehensive discussion, "Combating Anti-Chinese Racism and Xenophobia during COVID-19 in Canada," presented by Dr. Guo Shibao and Dr. Guo Yan (University of Calgary, Canada) and the ethnographic study "Caught in the Middle? Chinese International Students' Self-formation amid Politics and Pandemic" by Yu Jing (俞菁), a Ph.D. Candidate at University of (接下页)



California, Santa Barbara. The session is available for streaming at the UT History Department's website Not Even Past. Madeline and Wei were grateful for support from the Department of History, the Center for Asian American Studies, and the Center for East Asian Studies at UT Austin, and the Arizona State University School of Social Transformation.

>> **The 4th workshop of The China Europe Research Platform on Migration on Chinese Migration to and beyond Europe (CERPE)** was held at the French National Center for Scientific Research (CNRS) Campus, Villejuif, Île-de-France, Paris and online, on Nov. 18-19, 2021. Co-sponsored by the Paris City Hall and the French Collaborative Institute on Migration, this workshop was hosted by the Cermes3, Centre for Research in Medicine, Science, Health, Mental Health, and Society.

In the new contexts of Chinese migrations in Europe and of migration flows between Europe and China since the Covid-19 pandemic, the 4th CERPE workshop aimed at increasing our knowledge of Chinese migrations in Europe and its latest and recent features. In order to foster exchanges and dialogues between Chinese migration studies and general migration studies, researchers external to the CERPE network were invited as discussants. They come from different academic institutions in France, the Netherlands, Belgium, and also China. (reported by Mette Thunø)
