## FROM THE ISSCO PRESIDENT >>

My heart was down when I was confronted with the idea of the 2023 President's New Year message. I clearly remember I wrote optimistically a year ago in my 2022 message that we entered 2022 in a cold pandemic winter, but we believed that this was the last chilly winter. Little did I expect that as 2022 slipped away, we would be confronted with yet another severe winter. We receive 2022 as the third year of pandemic, which is engulfing people's health, even life. It is devastating in mainland China, as my family members and myself, my relatives, friends, colleagues and students are knocked down by Corvid 19 in succession and struggled for survival.

Perhaps I shouldn't be so pessimistic about 2023. Looking beyond is the dawn of victory. After all, we had our successes in 2022. On November 11, 2022, the 30th Anniversary Conference of ISSCO was held in San Francisco, the birthplace of the association 30 years ago. About 300 scholars from all over the world participated in the conference in-person or online. We are gratified that many founders of ISSCO, notably Wang Ling-Chi of the United States, Teresita Ang See of the Philippines, Karen Harris of South Africa, and Ma Mung of France, were present at the conference. Wang Gungwu, the first president of ISSCO and now a nonagenarian, delivered an online speech. The five founding members, together with scholars of different generations, discussed research of Chinese overseas, covering its history, contemporary issues and future prospects. Their dedication to scholarship under hardship was a testimony to the vitality of the Chinese overseas studies community.

I would like to take this opportunity again to thank Professor Wang Ling-Chi, Professor Lok Siu of University of California Berkeley and their wonderful team for successfully organizing the conference in San Francisco! My appreciation also goes to Professor Zhang Zhenjiang, Professor Dai Fan of Jinan University and their dedicated team for their excellent organization of the parallel conference in China! Naturally, it is the unrelenting efforts of many scholars in the Chinese overseas studies community that continue to give luster to the thirty years old ISSCO!

In September 2022, an election committee consisting of Teresita Ang See, Tan Chee Beng and Peter Li, three ex-official members of ISSCO, took charge of the ISSCO Board election. Using online communication and balloting, a new ISSCO board was elected and constituted. I appreciate the trust of ISSCO members to elect me as president for another term. Despite the challenge of sliding on thin ice, as the Chinese saying goes, I shall do the best I can, and work with all of you to advance our common cause. I look forward to your continuing support!

Finally, as we bid farewell to the past and welcome the beginning of a future, I wish you and your family a healthy and auspicious new year in a blissful world without the pandemic!

### Teresita Ang SEE (洪玉华)

**Academic Work:** Teresita Ang See organized three panels (I. Racialization and Colonial Experiences; II. Sinophobia, Socio-Cultural & Political Engagements; III. COVID-19 and Chinese in the Philippines) at the 30th Anniversary Conference of the International Society for the Study of Chinese Overseas, held at Kabuki Hotel, San Francisco, California, USA on Nov. 11-12, 2022.

**Socio-Development Work:** Through Kaisa Para Sa Kaunlaran and the Kaisa Heritage Foundation, Teresita Ang See participated in various outreach activities and relief operations for typhoon, earthquake and fire victims, and helped with fund-raising for scholarships for orphans of the anti-drug war in 2016-2022. Rice assistance was also given throughout the year to jeepney drivers, street cleaners and other marginalized communities. School and office supplies as well as other forms of educational assistance were given to remote schools in dire needs. For 34 years, Teresita Ang See has continued to provide weekly medical assistance and supply of medicines non-stop since 1988. This kind of work continues to serve as an effective bridge between the Tsinoys and their Pinoy brethren in the mainstream society and to facilitate understanding and acceptance.

Chinben See Memorial Library continues to serve as a very important resource center for research and materials on the Chinese overseas, especially the Chinese in the Philippines as well as local and regional Philippine history and society books and journals that contain references on the Chinese in the Philippines. The archival collection of newspaper and publications, sourced from the Philippines and from China, provides a wealth of otherwise inaccessible research information.



### ZHOU Min (周敏)

Min ZHOU has been elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. She has been inducted to the Faculty Mentoring Honor Society at the University of California, Los Angeles.

Min ZHOU received another teaching grant (US\$20,000) from the Eurasia Foundation (in Japan), which will sponsor her to offer a large undergraduate lecture course at UCLA on "Asian Community: Cross-Border Movements, Diasporic Formation, and Social Transformations in the Asian World." She also received a grant (\$165,000) on her project, "Research and Training on Global Chinese Philanthropy," from the Cyrus Tang Foundation.

Supported by the Cyrus Tang Foundation, the UCLA Asia Pacific Center has launched a virtual training program on Global Chinese Philanthropy under the directorship of Professor Min Zhou. The 2022-23 program aims to stimulate interest and nurture passion in philanthropy among college students. Participants will gain critical knowledge in the field of philanthropy and deepen their interest in volunteerism, non-profit work, and civic engagement. Students will also have opportunities to network with leading scholars and professionals in the field! Participants (见下页)

will receive a Certificate of Participation in Global Chinese Philanthropy Training if they: 1) attend at least two public GCP quarterly lectures; 2) participate in the half-day workshop in the Spring quarter; 3) submit written feedback after the lecture/training workshop; and 4) complete training-related surveys and evaluations. ## **The 30th Anniversary ISSCO Conference "Diasporic Futures: Sinophobia, Techno-Political Strife, and the Politics of Care."**

From November 11th to 12th, 2022, UC Berkeley's Asian American Research Center hosted the 30th Anniversary ISSCO Conference, themed "Diasporic Futures: Sinophobia, Techno-Political Strife, and the Politics of Care." Returning to San Francisco for the 30th anniversary of the founding conference in November 1992, the conference drew over two hundred and fifty participants from six continents. Mae Ngai, Lung Family Professor of Asian American Studies and Professor of History at Columbia University, delivered a keynote speech titled "The Chinese Question: The Origins of the Global Regime of Chinese Exclusion."

The conference featured three symposia bringing together a range of distinguished scholars and speakers: "The Pandemic and Anti-Asian Violence in the U.S.," featuring Russell Jeung (SFSU), John Walsh (UMass), and Cynthia Choi (CAA), moderated by Henry Der (CAA); "Racial Profiling and Discrimination against Chinese American Scientists and Engineers," featuring Gang Chen (MIT), Xiaoxing Xi (Temple), Sherry Chen (U.S. National Weather Service), and Jeremy Wu (APA Justice), moderated by Judge Lillian Sing; and "Changing US-China Relations and Their Impact on Chinese in the U.S. and Elsewhere," featuring Gordon Chang (Stanford), K.J. Noh, Judge Julie Tang, and George Koo, moderated by Don Tow (NJ-ALPHA). Additionally, Ling-chi Wang (UC Berkeley), Karen Harris (University of Pretoria), Emmanuel Ma Mung (CNRS), and Teresita Ang See (PACS) convened the ISSCO Founders' Roundtable, moderated by Madeline Hsu (UT Austin). The conference also featured nearly seventy panels of presentations, with remote panels hosted by UCLA and Jinan University. # The 30th Anniversary ISSCO Parallel Conference “The Present, Future and New Trends of Global Chinese in the Covid-19 Epidemic” in China



From November 12th to 13th, 2022, the 30th Anniversary Conference of the International Society for the Study of Chinese Overseas Parallel Conference in China was successfully held by the School of International Studies/ Academy of Overseas Chinese Studies at Jinan University. Nearly 150 scholars from universities both at home and abroad were invited to present on the new trends of global Chinese in the covid-19 epidemic, especially focusing on Chinese diaspora. Six parallel forums covered topics including the emergence of and changes to Chinese diaspora, Chinese diaspora communities, identities, entrepreneurship, and cultural communication with China. Discussions by a total of 30 groups both on- and off-line touched not only macro-level topics such as diplomatic relations between major countries but also micro-level topics such as occupation, gender, marriage, and kinship.

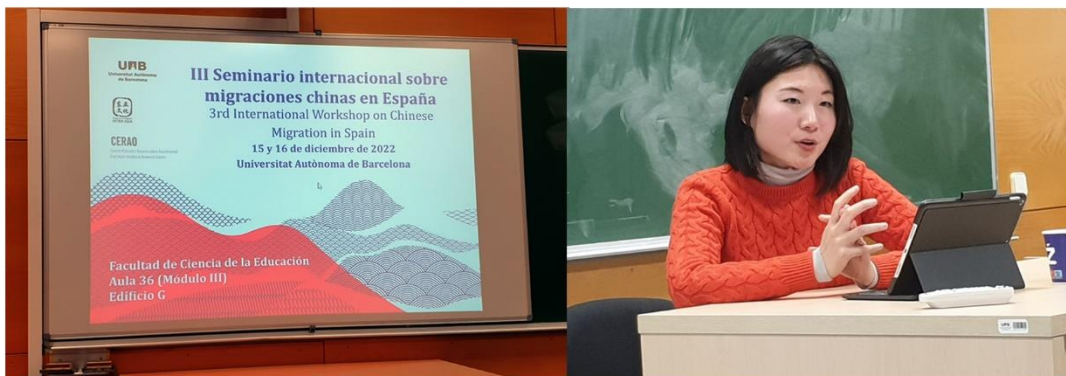
This conference showcased the latest developments in research on overseas Chinese communities around the world. As the overseas Chinese community has taken roots in various regions, it has become stronger economically with ever-increasing social status and ever-diversifying organizational forms. Due to the ongoing pandemic, unilateralism and (接下页)



racism that have caused serious impacts on the shifting grounds of the world we live in, the overseas Chinese community in recent years has particularly faced a series of new issues and challenges. For instance, new diasporic communities have emerged and formed close ties with the backbones of the Chinese society; social media networks have facilitated online dialogue and interaction, as an important platform for expressing the identities of overseas Chinese; developments in e-commerce and the digital economy have not only strengthened transnational mobility but also provided new ways of livelihood and opportunities for entrepreneurship for overseas Chinese laborers and business people; anti-Chinese and anti-Asian racism has triggered responses from overseas Chinese communities. Overall, whether in terms of economic development, diplomatic relationship, or cultural exchange, the Chinese diaspora—despite the unique or comparative advantage of individual groups—can be a tight-knit community with shared interest and “common destiny”.

For over three decades, ISSCO has dedicated to promoting intellectual exchange and collaboration within the field of the study of Chinese overseas. As one of the most important academic events in the field, this conference exemplified the latest developments in research at home and abroad, proposed new ideas for studying overseas Chinese, and broadened new horizons for the whole field.

## **The 3rd International Workshop on Chinese Migration in Spain. December 15-16, 2022. Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona.**



Since the last edition of this international workshop in 2017, research on Chinese migration in Spain has increased significantly. New phenomena of great impact such as the Covid-19 pandemic and international tension with broad repercussions on China and its position in the world have had consequences affecting globalization and the established imaginary about China. The contributions to the workshop analyzed continuities and transformations of Chinese migration in Spain against the background of emerging realities, demonstrated the state of the field, and identified new needs and trends for further investigation. There were 27 participants from 12 different research centres and institutions located in Spain, China, United Kingdom and France. The keynote lecture “Continuities and transformations of Chinese migration to Europe: some thoughts from the French case and beyond” was delivered by Wang Simeng, Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique (CNRS).
