

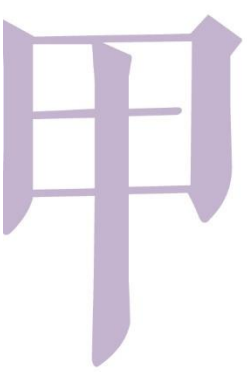

## FROM THE ISSCO PRESIDENT >>

We became so absorbed in our work --- reading, teaching, writing, and field-researching --- that we were oblivious to the coming of 2024! This is the Year of Dragon in China. Allow me to take advantage of the rich symbolism of the dragon in the Chinese culture to wish you a year filled with happiness, prosperity, and good health, like a flying dragon on auspicious clouds!

In November 2023, the ISSCO regional conference was successfully held in Bangkok, Thailand, the first time an entirely offline conference for ISSCO since the outbreak of COVID-19 in 2020. Scholars from different parts of the world finally had a chance to get together to discuss issues of shared interests. The theme of the 2023 Bangkok conference was Chinese Overseas: Integration, Identities, and Transnational Connectivity. The conference received over 130 papers from scholars in 18 countries, covering disciplines such as history, economy, society, arts, culture, and language. Many in ISSCO had long desired a conference in Thailand given its sizable ethnic Chinese population and the Chinese contribution to Thailand and Thai society. The Institute of Science Innovation and Culture, Rajamangala University of Technology Krungthep, Thailand, helped our dream to come true, for which we deeply appreciate.

I am pleased to report that ISSCO will collaborate with Maranatha Christian University in Bandung, Indonesia to hold the next regional conference in November (7th, 8th) of 2024. Indonesia is also a country with a sizable ethnic Chinese community, where millions of ethnic Chinese have lived, worked, and made contributions for generations. Their destiny has always been inseparable from the development of Indonesian society. We look forward to the academic gathering with colleagues from all over the world in Bandung. It would allow us a chance to examine the past, present and future of Chinese Overseas.

As you all know, despite the long history of Chinese overseas in many countries all over the world, especially in Southeast Asia, and despite their many contributions to their host societies, the social status of Chinese overseas has been precarious and tentative and the Chinese have sometime become targets of scapegoats, subject to the changing social tides in their host country, as well as international political vicissitudes. 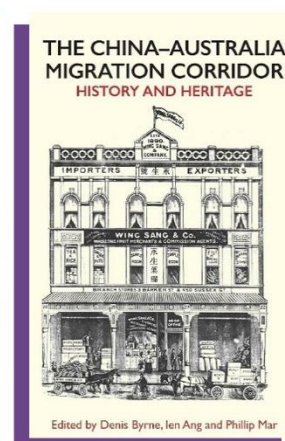
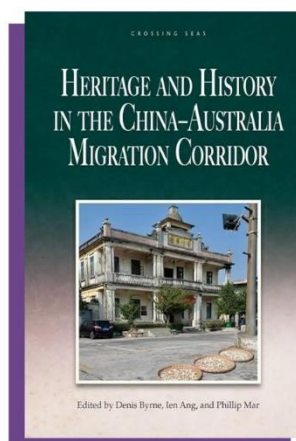
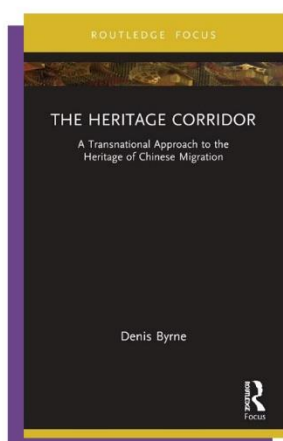

### Denis Byrne

The book launch of *The China-Australia Migration Corridor: History and Heritage* at Darling Square Library organised by the Institute for Culture and Society (ICS) at Western Sydney University, held on February 17, 2024, near Sydney's Haymarket Chinatown. Initially published in 2022 as a solo endeavour by Professor Denis Byrne under the title *The Heritage Corridor: A Transnational Approach to the Heritage of Chinese Migration*, the research then took shape as a collaborative volume in the following year. The hardcover edition, *Heritage and History in the China-Australia Migration Corridor* was released by Hong Kong University Press in 2023; it was simultaneously printed by Melbourne University Press as *The China–Australia Migration Corridor: History and Heritage*.



### Joaquín Beltrán Antolín

Joaquín Beltrán Antolín has embarked on a project in relationship with Chinese migration in Europe and beyond: *AspirE – Asian prospects in (re)migration to/within the EU*. Antolín has also embarked on a 3-year research project (2023-2025) that examines the decision making of aspiring (re)migrants from selected Southeast and East Asian countries (China, Japan, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam) to and within selected EU member countries (Belgium, the Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Italy, and Portugal).



### Teresita Ang See (洪玉华)

Teresita Ang See delivered a lecture on “The Ties that Bind: Shared history, Shared Destiny, Shared Heritage”, at China Studies Center, New Era University, June 30, 2023.

Teresita Ang See delivered a lecture on “KAISA HERITAGE CENTER: Repository of the Historical and Cultural legacy of the Ethnic Chinese in Philippine Life”, as a series of Tsinghua Beijing Research Agenda on Chinese Overseas, Nov. 2023.



Teresita Ang See is the main editor for this first trilingual edition of *孙子兵法* / *Sining ng Pakikidigma ni Sun Tzu* / *The Art of War* by Sun Tzu, original in Chinese by Sun Wu 孙武 著, translated into English and Filipino by Fernando Ang Sr. 洪晓明 译 (Kaisa Para Sa Kaunlaran, Inc., 2023). Six other editors painstakingly edited the English and Filipino translations to hew to the true nuance of the original version.



### **WANG Yi (王祎)**

Wang Yi is a new member of ISSCO, from Wenzhou University. She is associate researcher and vice Dean of Overseas Chinese College. Her main research interests are international Chinese merchant, overseas Chinese in Russia and overseas Chinese economy.



### **YOU Tianlong (游天龙)**

YOU Tianlong is a new member of ISSCO, from Yunnan University, China. He was appointed Chair of the Department of Sociology in the School of Ethnology and Sociology in December 2023. His research interests lie in Chinese America, in particular the current wave of "Line-walkers" entering into the United States across the southern border, as well as in Chinese immigrants in contemporary Southeast Asia, especially entrepreneurs and capitalists. His research has been published in well-acclaimed journals in both English and Chinese.



### **ZHANG Huanping (张焕萍)**

Zhang Huanping is a new member of ISSCO, from the China Institute for Chinese Overseas Studies. She is currently the Deputy Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Chinese Overseas History Studies. Her research concentrates on Chinese diaspora, international communication and the new media.



### **ZHANG Zhenjiang (张振江)**

Zhang Zhenjiang is a new member of ISSCO, from Jinan University. He was the Dean of the School of International Relations/Institute of Overseas Chinese Studies at Jinan University. His research interests include the history and theory of international relations, the history of American diplomacy, East Asian international relations, Southeast Asian regional cooperation, and China-U.S. relations.



### **ZHOU Min (周敏)**

Min ZHOU, University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), has been elected to the U.S. National Academy of Sciences in May 2023 after being inducted to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in the previous year.

## **ISSCO REGIONAL CONFERENCE**

**9-10 DECEMBER 2023**

The conference garnered a bountiful harvest of 125 papers divided into Thai (3 papers) English (54 papers) and Chinese (68 papers). Panels covered topics including language, culture and arts; history, immigration (including illegal immigrants), mobility, transnational connections; Covid pandemic and rise of racism; integration, identity, adaptation, transformation; politics, business and religion. The most number of papers were still on southeast Asia, followed by papers on Asia (including Hong Kong and Taiwan), the U.S., Europe, Australia-New Zealand. The topics and issues covered by the conference have expanded a lot since ISSCO started in 1992. (续下页)



The definitions and stock knowledge of different issues have become more fluid and changed in many ways as the time periods, locations, and experiences of the Chinese communities differ. Our understanding of identity has also expanded, as Chinese have been distributed to wider areas. Despite the differences due to the disparities among the countries where the Chinese found themselves, they have become even more similar, in terms of problems, experiences, challenges, coping mechanisms, and social interactions. ISSCO's presence, its research contributions, and the conferences it organizes through the years will continue to be significant and relevant in these turbulent times of conflict and racial biases. ISSCO will continue to promote harmony, cohesion and greater understanding among ethnic minorities through forums and dialogues. (By Teresita Ang See )

## **International Symposium on “Global Chinese Philanthropy (GCP) and Transformative Impacts during and after a Global Crisis” 15-16 DECEMBER 2023**

It was co-organized by the Asia Pacific Center (APC) at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) and the Academy of Overseas Chinese Studies at Jinan University (JNU). More than 30 scholars from China, the United States, Europe, and Southeast Asia gathered to deliver two keynotes and 26 presentations. The symposium was organized into eight sessions: Opening Session and Keynote Speeches; Panel I: Voluntarism, Entrepreneurship, and NGOs in Times of Crisis; Panel II: Global Chinese Philanthropy in Comparative Perspectives; Panel III: Philanthropic Practices in Diasporic Chinese Communities in Southeast Asia and their impacts on host and home societies; Panel IV: History and Development of Chinese Diaspora Philanthropy across the Globe; Panel V: Global Chinese Philanthropy: Diasporic Culture and Transnationalism; Panel VI: Promoting Voluntarism and Philanthropy; and a Roundtable Discussion on The Future of Research and Collaboration in GCP. Participants showcased cutting-edge research and were engaged with interdisciplinary discussions on shifting paradigms, methodologies, empirical findings, best practices, and theoretical and policy implications for GCP studies. This symposium has elevated discussions on GCP to a high level as a culmination of the Global Chinese Philanthropy (GCP) Research and Training program at UCLA's Asia Pacific Center, which is supported by the Cyrus Tang Foundation and Long Family Foundation and dedicated to networking building, innovative research, and training to foster volunteerism and philanthropic spirit in the younger generation. ## **6th CERPE Workshop “In an Era of Uncertainties and New Opportunities. Chinese Migrations in Europe” 16-17 NOVEMBER 2023**

It was held at the Iscte-University Institute of Lisbon and took a hybrid form. The panels covered topics such as: Politics and Governance; Chinese Youth; Labour Market; COVID and post-COVID pandemic; Chinese International Students; New Mobilities; Transnational Families and Migration Trajectories; Art, Language and Culture; Sexuality and Identity. 34 papers were presented by 49 researchers. The workshop was organized by Sofia Gaspar, Thai França and Catia Miriam Costa. The opening remarks were given by Li Minghuan and Mette Thuno. The Handbook of Chinese Migration to Europe (Brill) was presented by Mette Thuno in the new series “Handbooks of Chinese Overseas” including a book on Chinese in France amid the Covid-19 pandemic by Wang Simeng.



## **Workshop “Invocación a las mayorías silenciosas” (Invocation to the Silent Majorities) 10 MAY 2023**

The workshop took place at the University of Barcelona. A Spanish-born descendant of a Chinese migrant presented her book of poetry about her experience in Spain. Several papers were presented as well and a round table concluded the workshop.



## **Workshop “Chinese migration” 20 NOV 2023**

It took place as part of the First InterAsia Research Progress seminar series at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona. Participants included Joaquin Beltran, Irene Masdeu, Laura Lamas-Abraira and Wang Zigang, and the event was coordinated by Amelia Saiz.



## **Tsinoy Conference “Regional and Transnational Connections of the Chinese in the Philippines” 27-28 JANUARY 2024**

Participants from Manila, Luzon, Visayas, Mindanao, Israel (Tel Hai College), United States of America (Boston University and University of Massachusetts, Amherst) and Hong Kong (Chinese University of Hong Kong) delivered papers at the conference. The panels covered topics including “Merchants, Laborers, Pioneer Settlers: Chinese and Chinese Mestizos in the Philippine Provinces during the 19th and 20th Centuries,” “Philippine Colonial Experiences, Sinophobia and the Status of Philippines-China Relations,” “Chinese in Regional Socioeconomic Life I; Community Building in Iloilo and Cebu,” “Chinese in Northern Mindanao: A Preliminary Study on Chinese Immigration, Activities and Tribulations in Northern Mindanao from 1890-1940,” “Family and Identity Formation,” “Chinese in Regional Socioeconomic Life 2,” “Hokkien across Time and Space: Language and Identity in the Philippines from Early Manila Hokkien to Lánnang-uè (1600s-2023),” “Historical and Historiographical Approaches to Chinese Identity and Representation,” and “Regulation and Evasion: Policing the Chinese in 19th to 20th Century Philippines.”

2023年10月27至30日，第六届“海外华人与中国侨乡文化”学术研讨会在温州大学举行。本次研讨会旨在探讨海外华侨华人与中国式现代化发展，推动学界对海外华侨华人与中国侨乡的深入研究，来自浙江、广西、广东、福建、海南、黑龙江等地，以及美国、新加坡、马来西亚、印度尼西亚和越南等国家的100余位专家学者出席了本次研讨会。专题讨论环节，与会专家学者聚焦海外华侨华人与中国式现代化的关系、华侨华人社会文化，侨乡社会与文化、移民与侨汇四个专题进行了热烈而深入的探讨，讨论涵盖了历史、文化、经济、政治、宗教、婚姻等多个研究领域，并以中国式现代化的新视角审视了侨乡建设的成就及未来侨乡建设面临的新挑战和新使命，充分展示了海外华侨华人与中国侨乡研究的多元性视角。

#### BACKGROUND

ISSCO was founded in 1992 by Professor Wang Gungwu of the National University of Singapore, with its first president Professor Wang Ling-chi of the Department of Ethnic Studies of the University of California, Berkeley. ISSCO is a scientific, non-political professional community for individuals and institutions interested in and committed to the study of Diaspora Chinese. ISSCO also provides facilities for research and scientific publications and supports national and international (续下页)



conferences organized by educational institutions in different countries. The papers presented in the study came from various academic domains related to Diaspora Chinese studies. Since 1992, every year ISSCO organizes conferences both regionally and internationally. ISSCO international conferences discuss Chinese issues globally, while regional conferences discuss Chinese in certain regions, such as in New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, Southeast Asia and so on.

## **THEME & SUBTHEMES**

The coming conference was commissioned by The International Society for the Studies of Chinese Overseas (ISSCO) in September 2023 to Maranatha Christian University which has a Centre for Chinese Diaspora Studies (CCDS) in the Faculty of Art and Design. The ISSCO regional conference will be held at Maranatha Christian University on November 7-8, 2024, and on November 9, 2024, a city tour visits sites in Bandung such as Gedung Merdeka (where the Asian-African Conference took place) and other places related to the presence of Diaspora Chinese in Bandung.

- Chinese Diaspora with Capability: as Stakeholders in Science, Technology, AI Engineering, in World's Turbulence of Political Rivalry
- Chinese Diaspora as Entrepreneurs in The Developing Countries Eco-Social Agent of Progress
- Chinese culture, language studies by Chinese diaspora as awareness of the root of ethnicity

Journal of Chinese Overseas History Studies was established in 1988 by the China Institute of Chinese Overseas Studies. It is the first academic journal in China to be openly issued both domestically and internationally, focusing on the study of issues related to Chinese Overseas. It is also the publication with the highest number of articles on Chinese Overseas research within China. Since 1998, it has continuously been a source journal for the "Chinese Social Sciences Citation Index" (CSSCI). Journal of Chinese Overseas History Studies primarily publishes papers on the history and current situation of Chinese Overseas, theories and policies on Overseas Chinese affairs, and international migration. The journal is focused on academic innovation, and features categorized columns such as "Special Essays," "Analysis and Discussion," "Exploring Historical Sources," as well as special columns like "Comparative Studies on International Migration," "Qiaoxiang Studies," and "New Immigrant Studies." The journal warmly welcomes contributions from domestic and international experts and scholar.
