ISSCO Regional Conference:

Chinese Overseas: Global and Local Dynamics

Nagasaki, Japan, November 17-19, 2017

The 11thRegional Conference of the International Society for the Study of Chinese Overseas (ISSCO) will take place in Nagasaki, Japan, from November 17-19, 2017. This will be the first ISSCO regional conference to be held in Japan. The city is located on the northwest coast of the Kyushu Island. Historically, Nagasaki was an important center for the junk trade of East and Southeast Asia. With the development of maritime trade between Tokugawa Japan and imperial China, a large number of Chinese merchants, Buddhist monks, artisans and literati gradually congregated in this port city. As a result, it became the origin of the overseas Chinese community in Japan and the first Chinatown in Japan was established here in the 1680s. The economic and cultural activities conducted by early Chinese migrants in Nagasaki contributed significantly towards the rapid growth of local economy and culture, and laid the solid foundation for the gradual integration of Chinese migrant into the host society. In other words, ISSCO Nagasaki 2017 will provide you with a rare opportunity to appreciate the unique history, culture and food of Nagasaki.

ISSCO Nagasaki 2017 welcomes panel proposals and individual paper and poster session proposals from members and non-members including academics, librarians and archivists, graduate students and undergraduate students. The conference will accept papers in English, Chinese as well as Japanese. Paper proposals in the case of English should include a 300-500 word abstract, a 150-word personal bio and a CV of no more than two pages with your email address and phone number included. Panel proposals should include the above as well as a panel abstract of 200-250 words. Abstracts, personal bios and CV's should be sent in a single attachment in either Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) or Rich File (.rft) format. Name the attachment with your last name and the words "paper proposal" (for individual paper proposals) or the panel organizer's last name and the words "panel proposal" (for panel presentations). The text should be prepared on letter/A4 size paper, single-spaced and in 12-point font. Please email your submission to the conference website.

世界海外华人研究学会(ISSCO)区域研讨会

"海外华人:全球化与地方化的活力"

2017年11月17日-19日·长崎

"2017年世界海外华人研究学会(ISSCO)区域会议"将于2017年11月17日至11月19日在日本长崎举办。世界海外华人研究学会系王赓武教授和王灵智教授等一批前辈学者于1992年在美国旧金山创立,学会致力于推动全球性的海外华侨华人研究与交流。根据学会章程,每三年学会将定期举行一次大型的国际学术研讨会。过去二十余年间,学会曾先后于旧金山、香港、马尼拉、台北、哥本哈根、北京、新加坡、吉隆坡和温哥华等地举办过大型的国际学术研讨会。与此同时,学会还曾在古巴、南非、新西兰、巴拿马和韩国等地举办过区域性的年度学术讨论会。

2017年度ISSCO区域国际学术研讨会的主题是"海外华人:全球化与地方化的活力"。目前,在全球化的进程日益深化扩大之时,地方化亦开始显现其活力,各种因素多元交错。最近欧洲的难民潮引起学术界和政府智囊决策机构的反思,同时也对以西方经验为主建立起的多元文化理论和社会实践提出了挑战。通过这次研讨会,我们期待世界各地学者透过各自不同的视角,从海外华侨、华人多样和共同的历史经验中,对本届会议的主题提供多元的思考和分析。

自ISSCO创始以来,这是第一次在日本举行国际学术研讨会。长崎位于日本列岛的南端,曾是日本华侨社会的发源地,也是当代日本华侨社会中主流与非主流融合的一个范本。历史上,长崎曾经是东亚和东南亚地区多边帆船贸易的重要港埠。400多年前,中国华南沿海及葡萄牙、荷兰等国的东西方商人来到长崎与九州其他地方,建立起自己的侨居社区。明清时期华侨所从事的各项经济、文化活动,对当时日本社会的经济贸易和文化领域都曾产生了极大的影响,并成为目前长崎华侨社会与日本社会逐步融合之重要的文化资本。如今的长崎虽已不是日本华侨聚居的中心,但若研究日本及东亚、东南亚的华侨史,长崎是不能略过的重要历史舞台。长崎独特的历史文化资源,使其成为多种文化交融的旅游城市。2017年11月举行的ISSCO长崎研讨会将让您领会富有长崎地域特色的「和·华·蘭」之多元的历史文化场景和美食佳肴。

2017年长崎ISSCO国际学术研讨会筹委会现诚挚地邀请阁下提交参加会议的专题演讲、论文组申请和个人论文报名,欢迎对此领域有兴趣及研究的学者、图书馆、博物馆等相关人士、研究生及本科生参与,不限会员和非会员。申请报名提案可以用中文、英文或日文形式提交,论文提案须包括300字至500字摘要、150字的个人学术简介,并附上联络邮箱、地址和联络电话。专题演讲提案除以上内容外,另需附上300字至500字的专题讲演摘要。

ISSCO Conference in Vancouver >>

The 9th International Conference of the International Society for the Study of Chinese Overseas (ISSCO) was held in Vancouver from July 6-8, 2016. This was the first time that an ISSCO conference was held in North America since the society's founding conference in San Francisco in 1992. The conference, which took place at the Sheraton Hotel in Richmond, a suburb of Vancouver, was well attended with a total of 182 presenters and 87 participants from around the world including 15 countries. ISSCO's founding president, Professor Wang Gungwu, delivered the conference's keynote speech to a packed audience, while Professors Elizabeth Sinn and Selia Tan served as plenary speakers. An especially notable feature of ISSCO Vancouver was the emphasis conference organizers placed on showcasing the rich history of the Chinese in Vancouver and British Columbia including their relations with BC's First Nations peoples through a series of documentary films, guest speakers and post-conference excursions. Featured events included: the private screening of a film on Chinese-Musqueam relations and award-winning films From C to C – Chinese Canadian Stories of Migration and Tricks on the Deadby Jordan Paterson, a Fraser River raft expedition to visit Chinese historical mining sites in BC, a historical tour of Chinatown and Musqueam territory, as well as a Richmond food tour and presentations on the history of Richmond and Chinese in Cuba.

Service to ISSCO >>

At the Issco conference held in Vancouver in July 2016, the ISSCO Board honored Teresita Ang See for her long service to ISSCO. She was Vice President of ISSCO, with Wang Gungwu as President and Wang Lingchi as Secretary-Treasurer from 1992 up to 2004 when she was elected President (2004-2007). Then from 2007 to 2016 she served as Secretary-Treasurer for three terms -- two terms under Leo Suryadinta and one term under Tan Chee-Beng. At the Vancouver conference a new ISSCO Board was elected, and the new secretary is Dr. Glen Peterson. The ISSCO Board also thank the other outgoing board members for their service, namely, Dr. Khun Eng Kuah-Pearce, Manying Ip and Dr.Tang Shi-Yeong. We also thank Dr.Cheong Yongrok for his long service as Northeast Asia representative. He remains in the ISSCO Board as Representative at Large. We welcome new board members, namely Dr.Ellen Palanca from the Philippines (Treasurer), Dr.Serizawa Satohiro representing Northeast Asia, Dr.Kee Pookong representing Oceania, and Dr.Richard Hsu representing Taiwan.

In addition, her recent book The Good Immigrants: How the Yellow Peril Became a Model Minority (Princeton University Press, 2015) has received a number of awards as follows: 2016 Robert H. Ferrell Book Prize; 2015 Theodore J. Saloutos Book Award; 2014-2015 Asian Pacific American Librarians Association Adult Non-Fiction Honor Book; 2015 Chinese American Librarians Association Award for non-fiction; 2016 Hamilton Book Award finalist.



ISSCO Ex-Officio Member **Prof. Peter S. Li** was made a member of the Order of Canada "for advancing social justice in Canada through his sociological research into race, immigration and multiculturalism." The announcement was made on 30 December 2015 by His Excellency the Right Honorable David Johnston, Governor General of Canada.



Prof. Wang Gungwu was given the Business China Excellence Award 2016 (by Business China Singapore). He gave the keynote lecture at the Asia Research Institute Workshop on Chinese Diaspora Studies in the Age of Global Modernity." Keynote Lecture, "A Mix of Expectations: Changes in Chinese Migration"; and also at the Global Asia Center of New York University Shanghai. He gave the Southeast Asian Ceramics Society's William Willetts Annual Lecture, "By Land or Sea: Ceramics and Silk"; and the National Library Board Lecture, "Chinese Identity and Loyalty in Singapore, 19th and 20th Century". At the National Library Lecture, he also launched the new book, A History of the Thai-Chinese, by Jeffery Sng and



Prof. Min Zhou has returned to University of California, Los Angeles, USA, to resume her position as Professor of Sociology & Asian American Studies and the Walter & Shirley Wang Endowed Chair in US-China Relations & Communications. She is also Director of the UCLA Asia Pacific Center (formally Asia Institute).
